

SAFETY-KLEEN SYSTEMS, INC SUBMITS RCRA HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT PERMIT RENEWAL APPLICATION

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) Division of Solid Waste Management (DSWM) received a Part A and Part B hazardous waste management permit application from SAFETY-KLEEN SYSTEMS, INC of Nashville on June 04, 2024, for the renewal of the current RCRA permit (TNHW-160). This facility (EPA ID TND981474125) is located in Davidson County at 215 Whitsett Road, Nashville, Tennessee 37210 (see map).

The current permit, TNHW-160, was issued on September 30, 2014, and effective for ten (10) years. Because the facility submitted their Part B renewal application at least 180 days before the current permit was set to expire, Tennessee Hazardous Waste Management Regulations allow the facility to continue to operate under the current permit until another permit is issued or denied. If renewed, the permit will allow the facility to continue to operate and maintain the hazardous waste for an additional ten years.

The current permit, TNHW-160, permits Safety-Kleen Systems to store a maximum storage limit of 15,000 gallons in an aboveground storage tank, 6,912 gallons in a container storage area, and a miscellaneous unit (two return and fill) with a capacity of 296 gallons. The hazardous materials stored in these units include petroleum naphtha parts washer solvent, aqueous solvent, immersion cleaner, dry cleaning waste and paint waste collected from customers or generated on-site and maintenance of financial assurance with the DSWM in an amount that meets the cost of providing that long-term care.

Safety-Kleen Systems published a public notice on March 28, 2024, advising that Safety-Kleen Systems would hold a pre-application public meeting on May 6, 2024, as required by Tennessee Rule 0400-12-01-.07(1)(m). The purpose of the meeting was to provide information, answer questions, and receive comments concerning the permit reissuance. No members of the public attended this meeting.

As set forth in the Regulations, a complete permit application, consisting of a Part A and a Part B, must include certain text, drawings, and other information adequate to demonstrate that the facility will comply with the various technical and administrative standards applicable to such a facility. Evaluation of the renewal application involves an in-depth review of the application materials by DSWM staff and subsequent correspondence between DSWM and the facility identifying and correcting any deficiencies in the submitted information.

Once it determines the application is complete, DSWM will make a tentative decision to either grant or deny the permit and issue either a draft permit or a notice of intent to deny the permit. Public Notice will be given of this tentative decision, and the public will have at least 45 days to submit written comments on the draft permit/proposed action. A public hearing, if requested, may also be held to receive public comments within this public comment period. After considering the public comments received and making any appropriate revisions, the DSWM director will issue a final permit decision to either issue a final permit or terminate the existing permit. A Response to Comments will also be issued at that time.
