<u>Serious Injuries</u> – Child care agencies are required to report any incidents involving a child in its care (including on and off-site activities) where treatment by a medical professional was necessary. It does not include instances where a medical professional examines the child but determines that no injury occurred or treatment is not necessary.

<u>Substantiated Instances of Child Abuse</u> - There were three instances of child abuse substantiated by the Department of Children's Services in child care centers during the reporting period:

- Lack of Supervision In this instance the perpetrator was unknown. Safety Plans were implemented at the agency until classroom staff completed additional training requirements.
- Lack of Supervision In this instance a safety plan was initially issued to close the infant room and thereafter the agency was issued a restricted license to prohibit infant care.
- Physical Abuse In this instance the perpetrator was identified and their employment at the agency was terminated.

<u>Child Deaths</u> - One (1) fatality occurred in a licensed child care center during this period. A four month old child died from Asphyxia due to an airway obstruction caused by bedding. The child was on his back on a thin blanket on the floor and rolled to his tummy.
